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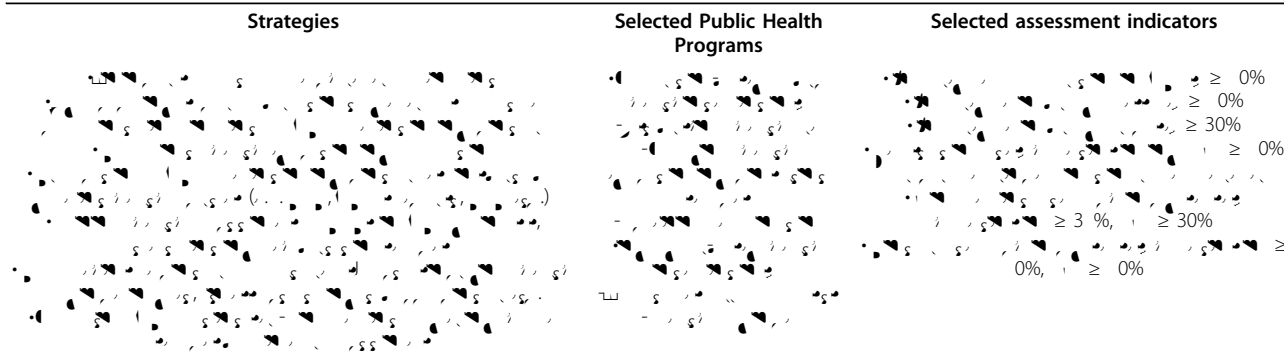
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3. Community health centers and NCD risk factors in China

Community health centers (CHCs) are the main health service providers in rural and urban areas of China. They provide a wide range of health services, including primary care, preventive care, and health promotion.
